

FIBRE CONSENT FORM – APARTMENTS, OFFICE BUILDINGS AND UNITS

Enable Networks Limited (**Enable**) has received a request to install our fibre broadband services into a building you own or manage.

Before we can connect customers in this building to our fibre network we need consent from all owners of the building or the owners' authorised agents. This consent gives Enable access to assess, install and maintain fibre optic cables and related equipment. Please review this document in detail, complete the second page and return to Enable.

Installing fibre broadband at your property

In most cases we install our own network infrastructure from the footpath to the edge of the relevant building via one or a combination of the following methods.

- a) Surface mounting the fibre cable to a suitable surface such as the railing on a fence.
- b) Burying the fibre cable in a soft surface such as grass or garden.
- c) Burying the fibre cable under a hard surface such as concrete by drilling or digging a trench.

Digging may be required for some of the installation methods. We aim to minimise disruption and will reinstate any surface we've disturbed on a "like for like" basis, for example asphalt where there was asphalt or grass seed where there was grass. We can't guarantee to match surface finish or colour and our reinstatement is limited to the surface we've disturbed.

There are some occasions where we can use existing ducting as part of the installation.

- If the building has unused telecommunication duct available, over which the owners can demonstrate ownership, we will try to use this duct.
- If Enable has installed red duct to the properties in the past, we will use this duct.

Enable will agree the internal route and cabling requirement as part of the scoping process.

Please note that by providing consent, you are also consenting to any additional work that may be required in the future by Enable's contractors to connect more customers at the property.

Please also note that because of the Privacy Act 1993, Enable is not able to advise any details as to which parties have or have not provided their consent.

Enable's commitment to you

We are committed to ensuring our network installation work has minimal impact on your property.

- All work on the property will be carried out to a professional standard in accordance with legal requirements and industry standards.
- We will use the installation method that has the least impact on your property.
- Our contractors will conduct themselves professionally while working on your property.
- We will always try to give reasonable advance notice, including a description of the work and the identity of the contractor who will be sent to carry out the work.
- Our contractors will endeavour to minimise disruptions and will leave your property in a neat and tidy state once the work is complete.
